

JMCA General Meeting Minutes - May 10, 2017

Neighborhood Updates

- Home and Garden Tour is scheduled for Saturday, June 17.
- Treasurer's Report will be published in the July newsletter.
- Welcome Wagon is about to send out their next round of deliveries. Baskets are delivered 2-3 times a year to new residents.
- The community yard sale brought in \$550 for Mount Eagle Elementary School
- Welcome to Manor resident and District Manager of Chili's Derek Cole who is a new advertiser in the newsletter

Updates and discussion regarding carjacking incident and suspect pursuit on May 9, 2017

- Description of the event: Suspect drove stolen vehicle up Edgehill Drive and on to Edgehill Court, damaging some vehicles and properties. At the dead end of Edgehill Court, he left the vehicle and fled on foot. Police pursued and apprehended about 1.5 hours after the carjacking incident.
- Police provided list of ways residents can find or receive information about police activity.
- Police are offering Neighborhood Watch training in June that is free and open to residents. One member of Jefferson Manor is signed up to attend.
- Concerns that schools were either not locked down quickly enough or not locked down at all was acknowledged. Concerns that alerts or quick communication were not available or received were acknowledged.

Presentation from Albemarle Project Manager from Fairfax County DOT

- Latesa Turner provided overview of the project and an outline of the phases. She notified residents that a formal meeting will be held tentatively on Thursday, June 15. More detailed project plans and designs will be available at that meeting.
- Residents expressed concerns about sidewalk width. Ms. Turner informed that the County will implement VDOT's 5-foot sidewalk standard and they have requested a waiver for a landscaped sidewalk buffer in order to reduce the amount of land acquisition required. A resident asked if the 5 foot sidewalks could be accommodated by taking a foot of roadway rather than a foot of residential property. A resident expressed concern about narrowing the street for wider sidewalks. A resident asked about the width of the recently redeveloped Fort Drive. There was not a conclusive determination about the width of the sidewalks on Fort Drive, but Ms. Turner advised that she would review the project.
