
GARDENING IN THE MANOR

As expected summer is making an early arrival, or at least we are having some hot days. But this is an opportunity to extoll the benefits of clay soil! I know our clay soil gets a very bad rap - and if you're new to it, it's really challenging to work with. So let me share what I've learned. First some of the clear benefits. Clay soil is great at holding on to moisture, so a hot day does not instantly result in drooping plants. The clay also holds on to nutrients quite well, which means there's less need to be fertilizing constantly. It's hard to work, but I've realized a pitch fork style tool works quite well to loosen soil and is less affected by the small rocks that are common in the Manor. I also find a narrow cutting style shovel works quite well in clay. Of course, it's also true that heavy clay is not what some plants, and most gardeners, want. To get started on improving the soil, adding organic matter is the way to go. I'm personally a fan of leaf based composts (which don't threaten peat bog habitats), which you can get at box stores or have delivered. You can actually use this as a top dressing if you're patient because our worms will do the work of pulling it deeper into the soil. Organic mulches like pine bark or hardwood mulch will work the same way, and I often use a bit of both. I choose smaller sized mulch; this is less likely to run off with rain but also works into the soil faster. Apply these top dressings regularly and your soil will get better and better!

IN THE VEGETABLE PATCH

I'm guessing many of you have opted for raised beds for vegetable gardening, and so have I. One cost of that is the moisture-holding clay is pretty far down. In hot weather you will need to water to keep those veggies happy. Given we've jumped into summer, I've started to put in the warm-weather crops, and even seeds seem to be happily germinating so long as I keep up with the watering. Warm weather veggies include favorites like tomatoes, eggplant and peppers as well as numerous herbs, especially basil! My biggest issue these days is that squirrels love to dig in that lovely raised-bed soil, so I'm thinking I may try a cover. I prefer finer mesh screening to the loose mesh monofilament cloth (i.e., with mesh on the order of ½ inch); that monofilament "cloth" traps birds and snakes and is really a nuisance to free them from.

Community Awareness

ROAD WORK AHEAD

It is repaying and restriping season again in the Manor, with many roads in and around our community set to be under construction in the coming months.

Spring is the beginning of the annual process that ends with hundreds of miles of roadways across the county being fixed up by the Virginia Department of Transportation. This work can also lead to new bike lanes, shoulders, crosswalks, signage and street markings.

Construction can start as early as April and will wrap up by November.

Most of the roads in the Manor are scheduled to be repayed this year, including Fairhaven Avenue, Monticello Road, Fort Drive, and nearby Bangor Drive.

The exact work dates for which roads will be repaved and when will be available about 10 days before the work begins, the county says. "No parking" signs will be posted at least three business days ahead.

The county asks that motorists be aware of temporary traffic pattern changes and that all parked cars, basketball hoops and garbage cans be removed from the street.

Work will usually be limited to outside rush hours, with crews planning to repave neighborhood streets on weekdays between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.

NEXT STOP: METRO SERVICE AND FARE CHANGES

If you like to use Metro to commute to the office or take a quick trip to the museums with the kids, there is some good news and some (not) so good news.

The Yellow Line is back!

Starting Sunday, May 7th, the Yellow Line will once again pull into the Huntington Metro Station, following many months of repairs. Here is what's new:

- Weekdays: Trains will run every 8 minutes.
- After 9:30 p.m. and on weekends: Trains will run every 12 minutes.
- Service will run between Huntington and Mount Vernon Square.
- Customers will have to switch to Green Line service after Mount Vernon Square to reach Greenbelt. (This is what speeds up service times on the Yellow Line.)
- Blue+ service between Huntington and New Carrollton will end.

Now to the (not) so great news: Metro fares will increase starting July 1. This is the first rate increase in five years for WMATA, and it was approved in mid-April.

Gone are the peak and off-peak pricing on weekdays before 9:30 p.m., but fares are higher for riders the farther they travel beyond the base of three miles. Maximum Metro fares are capped at \$6.

For Jefferson Manor residents, here is a breakdown:

- For example, if you plan to take a trip from Huntington to Metro Center on a weekday, it currently costs \$3.40 (off-peak) and \$4.10 (peak).
- With the increase starting July 1, that same trip will cost \$4.40 anytime from 5 a.m. to 9:30 p.m.
- But on weekends and weekdays after 9:30 p.m., Metro will charge a flat \$2.
- Senior/disabled rates will remain at 50% of the new pricing.
- Metro is adding a low-income program that SNAP recipients can sign up for to get reduced fares.
