Home and Garden

GARDENING IN THE MANOR

The gardening season is almost upon us. I'm in the last stages of planning; if you are too here's some food for thought. If you're as keen to attract a diversity of pollinators and birds to your garden as you are to have beautiful plants then be thinking about how you can lengthen the season of nectar and pollen availability and offer up those resources to beneficial insects with a diversity of mouth parts. Perhaps first, be aware that some cultivars that focus on extra-large, densely petalled flowers have bred out or made inaccessible nectar or pollen resources. If your goal is to offer those resources, do a bit of reading about any cultivars you're considering. Extending the season of flowering in your yard is a simple matter of considering when things are likely to bloom. We are lucky that our abundant maples bloom so early. Flower shape is another indicator of who can access floral resources, open flowers like coneflowers; sneezeweed (which does not cause sneezes), goldenrods, and asters provide widely accessible resources while those with more tubular flowers, such as coral honeysuckle, the beebalms, and lobelias, attract pollinators with longer tongues, including hummingbirds!

IN THE VEG PATCH

In the context of growing food, we are all limited by the small size of our yards. I've found the approach called "square-foot gardening" intriguing. This is an approach that focuses on each square foot of your garden bed and how to distribute bigger plants across square-foot plots and underplant with smaller plants or plants with earlier timing. In principle the formula is 1 extra large plant, 4 large plants, 9 medium plants and 16 small plants ALL in each square-foot plot. I'm going to give this one a try! If your curiosity is peaked, a quick internet search will bring up several introductions for beginners.



Mid-Year Update and Call for Donations from the Mount Eagle Elementary PTO

Despite a few snow days and late starts this year, Mount Eagle Elementary School is more than halfway through the 2023-2024 academic calendar, and its families and staff are looking forward to a warm spring at our neighborhood school! The Parent-Teacher Organization (<u>https://mteaglepto.com/</u>) continues to work closely with Principal Jean Consolla to organize evening activities for Mount Eagle's families as well as many staff appreciation events to let the hardworking teachers, specialists, and administrative staff know they are deeply appreciated. Since August, the PTO has organized a Puzzles and Pizza, Trunk-R-Treat, BINGO Night, and several "thank you!" deliveries of baked goods, coffee, seltzers, and other snacks to the staff lounge.

With regular school field trips in full swing after a multi-year hiatus, the **PTO is supporting the full cost of every class trip** to ensure that these enrichment activities place no financial burden on families. Public appropriated funds to Fairfax County Public Schools cannot be used to fund these events. So far this year, the PTO has covered the costs of trips to Shlagel Farms, Huntley Meadows, and the Air & Space Museum. Future trips are being planned to visit the National Zoo (1st), Mt. Vernon (2nd), Green Spring Gardens (3rd), Science Museum of Virginia (4th & 5th) and Hemlock Overlook Park (6th).

For the first time in four years, the PTO is **organizing after-school clubs**. We are especially committed to offering need-based financial assistance for any activities that come at cost to families. Beginning in early March, Kids Spanish will offer after-school instruction for Kindergarteners and First Graders. In the 2024-2025 school year, the PTO hopes to expand and offer activities like Legos, art, and sports. Leads on other programs and volunteers are welcome!

These efforts carry a considerable cost, one that far exceeds the dues paid by students' families. Our goal is to raise \$10,000 from community members and local businesses for the 2023-2024 academic year. 2023 JMCA TREASURER'S REPORT

2023 was finally a "normal" year for Manorites post-COVID pandemic. We delighted in being with each other at our trademark community events: Spring JM Park Clean-up, Community Yard Sale, Block Party, Chili Cook-off, Holiday Extravaganza and other activities like community meetings, holiday decorating contests and food trucks.

While we didn't meet our record-breaking membership of 235 in 2022, we came close with 221 out of 593 Manor households---37% of the neighborhood---a great membership rate for a civic association!

Funds for these events, activities and administrative costs come from our modest dues, newsletter advertising and additional generous donations from neighbors---Manorites donated over \$1,500 for the Block Party alone! Funds also support JMCA outreach---we donated all Community Yard Sale proceeds plus a matching \$300 from the JMCA for a total of \$1,530 to our neighborhood school, Mount Eagle Elementary!

The JMCA had a break-even 2023 financially thanks to support from Manorites, local business sponsors and other contributions.

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
