GARDENING IN THE MANOR

Planting season is upon us, woot woot! Fall is a fabulous time to plant trees, shrubs, and perennials. They may not be in bloom or even in leaf but putting them in the ground in fall will give them time to really settle into the soil and expand their root system before the growing season. You might not expect it, especially if the plant appears entirely dormant, but it's not a bad idea to keep the soil moist much as you would if you planted any other time of year. Remember they are growing underground. The box stores tend to focus on plants that are looking good at the moment, so if you're looking for something specific you may not find it there. Dedicated nurseries will have a larger selection so going out of your way can pay off.

IN THE VEG PATCH



Winter veg gardening is also an opportunity. Many crops that wilt under summer heat can be grown in fall, many of these even tolerate light frosts. Some candidates include beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, lettuce, mustard, onions, radishes, spinach, and turnips. There are also longer growing options that can be sown in fall for spring harvest, including daikon radish and Fava beans!

UPDATE FROM THE MOUNT EAGLE PARENT-TEACHER ORGANIZATION



It's a time of change! The Mount Eagle community said goodbye to Principal Jean Consolla this summer, and we wish her success as the new Principal of Fort Hunt Elementary School. We congratulate former Assistant Principal, Kate Kirkland, as the new proud principal of Mount Eagle.

The PTO is planning for a full slate of events during the 2024-2025 school year. To meet these goals, we have set a fundraising target of \$10,000 to support:

- **Field trips** FCPS budgets cannot be used for off-campus excursions, so we completely defray these costs to ensure that they place no financial burden on families.
- **Staff recognition** We organize events to regularly thank the teachers and staff for their dedicated work.
- Extracurricular activities Last year, the PTO organized and helped to sponsor a weekly after-school Spanish class for K and 1st grade students. We are hoping to add more clubs (e.g. chess, art, Legos, sports) in the future.
- **Community events** Although these evening or weekend events serve as fundraisers using volunteers and in-kind contributions, our general funds ensure that Bingo, Multicultural Night, Puzzles and Pizza, Earth Day, and the community garden are properly resourced.

JM RECYCLING AND TRASH SERVICES BASICS



Recycling and Trash technicians are appreciated for working in all kinds of weather and the Manor never missed a waste pickup during the pandemic. Fairfax County Solid Waste Management Program recently sent its annual brochure outlining our county-provided recycling and trash services and guidelines for what is accepted. The standard weekly home service also includes five annual "Special Pick-ups" and is paid from our real estate taxes; other waste pick-up needs are fee-based or you can drop off materials at the two county recycling and disposal centers (fees may apply depending upon material/items).

The county allots each residence a 90-gallon gray waste cart and a 60-gallon blue recycling cart. Yard Waste can be set out in your own container labeled "Yard Waste" or in up to TEN compostable/paper bags. Years ago, the county also provided a limited amount of 60-gallon green Yard Waste carts (since discontinued) but you may still spot a few in the Manor. County guidelines state that waste materials need to be ready curbside for pick-up by 6:30 a.m. each Tuesday in the Manor. Occasionally, a pick-up may be missed but is usually picked up the next day; contact them if isn't.

Waste and Recycling carts allotted to county residences are considered county property; however, the homeowner is responsible for maintaining the carts (e.g., using them appropriately and replacing damaged ones).

The Manor is famous for being dog-friendly and we definitely noticed a puppers increase during the pandemic! Thank you for "scooping the poop" and it should be deposited into your own waste receptacle AND be DOUBLE-bagged, whether one inside the other or one inside an overall trash bag.

Aligning with the national "America Recycles Day," Fairfax Recycles Day has been recognized by the Board of Supervisors on November 15 for several years. The County's Solid Waste Management Program traditionally celebrates November 15 with various events, contests and giveaways. https://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/publicworks/recycling-trash/america-recycles-day

SEPTEMBER IS NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS MONTH

Most of you know me as your friendly neighborhood election officer or JMCA treasurer, but today I'm wearing a different hat: I'm also a Certified Emergency Manager®. FEMA has designated September (the peak of Atlantic hurricane season) as National Preparedness Month.

Our community is vulnerable to several natural hazards, including:

- Severe storms with heavy winds and rain (up to and including hurricanes and tornadoes)
- Winter storms
- Extreme heat
- · Disease outbreaks

We should also be prepared to deal with manmade disasters like acts of violence or a cyberattack. Finally, we should all be ready to face those calamities that can happen anytime and anywhere, like a house fire, medical emergency, or vehicle crash. Regardless of what happens, there are three big things you can do to keep you and your family safe when disaster strikes: make a plan, be equipped, and stay informed. (We call this all-hazards preparedness.)



Make a plan

When time is of the essence, you don't want to be fumbling around to find the dosage of your family member's daily medication or the phone number for your homeowners insurance. Taking the time to write down the essentials ahead of time will ensure that you can find the information you need when you need it. ReadyNOVA has a multilingual, 5-step tool that builds your emergency plan for you: https://en.readynova.org/family. When everything is documented, make physical and digital copies of it so you can access it easily when the time comes. Download a copy to your phone (and your spouse's). Save it on your preferred cloud storage site. Print it out and put a copy in the glove box. Store another hard copy with your will/insurance paperwork/etc. Once you've done the work to assemble this information, make sure it's easy to find when you need it.

Organize your supplies

In the event of a widespread disaster, we can expect help to arrive pretty quickly, but not immediately. (Several of us were without power for over a day after that bad thunderstorm last July.) The bigger the incident, the longer it will take for help to arrive, so it's a good guideline to be self-sufficient for 3-5 days. You want to be able to meet all your baseline survival needs including food, water, and shelter. FEMA's list is a good starting point, but be sure to customize it to your family's needs (do you need dog food? feminine supplies?): https://www.ready.gov/kit. You likely already have most of the necessary items, but maybe not all together.

In our tiny houses, where should you keep all this stuff? Like your plan, it's best to have everything together where it's easy to access. Personally, I have shelves in the basement that always hold bottled water and canned food (plus, coincidentally, first aid supplies and a weather radio) -- when there's not an emergency it's just overflow pantry space, but when there's a problem, I am ready.

Stay informed

How will you find out that something is happening? Fairfax County will text you if there's an emergency in the area: https://tinyurl.com/FFXalerts. They use an integrated alerting system, so you can also sign up to receive traffic information, a reminder to pay your car tax or dog tag, etc. Don't forget to also sign up for alerts in other places you frequent, like an office or family home.

Take some time this Preparedness Month to get yourself and your family organized, no matter what Mother Nature (or anyone else) throws at us. Ready neighbors make for a resilient neighborhood!





Join us for our Community Meeting on Thursday, September 26. There will be info about Emergency Preparedness and a special election for an open director position on the Board.
