

#### **Community Awareness**

Racially restrictive covenants were clauses in property deeds that limited who could own or use the land based on race, ethnicity, or religion. These covenants were used to exclude people of color from certain neighborhoods and to maintain racial segregation. While the Fair Housing Act of 1968 made racially restrictive covenants illegal, it did not require this discriminatory language to be removed from existing land records.

At November's community meeting, Dr. Krystyn Moon of the University of Mary Washington spoke about her work documenting and mapping the remaining in Fairfax racial covenants and surrounding counties, including most properties here in Jefferson Manor. While an individual home's chain of title may appear clean, the deeds of dedication that govern nearly every lot in the Manor included this language:

"No part of the land contained in this Subdivision shall ever be used, or occupied by, or sold, demised, transferred, conveyed unto, or in trust for, leased, or rented, or given to any person or persons not of the Caucasian Race, except that this covenant shall not be held to exclude partial occupancy of the premises by domestic servants of the occupants thereof."

In 2020, Virginia streamlined the process for property owners to release particular unconstitutional and discriminatory covenants from their property. JMCA is working to organize instructions that will help interested homeowners file the appropriate paperwork with the county to update their land records. Please keep an eye on this newsletter and JeffersonManor.org as we plan to make these forms accessible in the near future.
