

### IN THE GARDEN

Is it time to take up gardening?



"Liberty gardens," the original "victory gardens" hail back to WWI, when the US government encouraged their planting at homes and in public spaces to supplement soldiers' rations and support starving communities in Europe. The effort produced critical food during the war and was reinvigorated in WWII. But less acknowledged, is what many learned during the Covid pandemic; gardening isn't just a supply chain solution, it's a genuine treatment for stress, depression, anxiety, and an overall boost to wellbeing. So, whether you're starting with flowers, veg, or house plants, you can expect some added joy!

For veg, containers or makeshift raised beds work surprisingly well. For the former, be sure to add drainage holes but otherwise just add soil and you're ready to plant seeds, starter potatoes, or other small plants. If you're going all in on a raised bed, it's worth a google to

learn more about layering approaches that keep costs down but also enrich the quality of the bed over time. Growing plants from seed is particularly rewarding and very inexpensive, or even free if you visit the Martha Washington Library seed selection. You also have a much wider variety of crops to choose from. Of course, you can quickly have more plants than you need, but that's just an opportunity to share with your neighbors! It's noteworthy that some crops really prefer to grow in place, root vegetables like carrots for example, but it's perfect timing to sow those now. If you find seeds are a bit of a faff, nurseries are already teaming with small plants. Happy growing!



### JEFFERSON MANOR PARK UPDATE

On March 31st, Darcey met with several representatives from the Fairfax County Park Authority to do a walkthrough of our park and get updates on the Jefferson Manor Park project. The big news is...we're almost done!

What has been completed:

- Asphalt trails were added to our park to bring it into compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- Along with updated grills, tables and brand-new benches, a bike rack was added at our pavilion, specifically due to our request for one!
- Our parking lot was updated to include 1 accessible parking space with a curb cut and lines delineating parking spaces (no more madness!)
- Due to our community input, three trees slated for removal near the baseball field were able to be saved by re-designing the path from the field to the pavilion
- Handrails have been added to the portions of the trail that are too steep to be ADA compliant - expansion gaps have been left in the longer handrail to meet structural requirements, but at Darcey's request these were given further grinding to help prevent pinched fingers!




### **JEFFERSON MANOR PARK UPDATE (CONTINUED)**

Still to come:

- The existing fence at the Dewey Drive entrance will be replaced with bollards and chains to direct pedestrians to the trail while allowing access for maintenance vehicles
- Updated park signage will be added at the entrances
- In order to minimize erosion into our creek, the protective construction fence will only be removed once the grass near the paved trails has grown to at least 80% coverage

Though the project is nearly done, our park will continue to receive updates from the Facilities and Natural Resources divisions of the Park Authority. On the horizon for our park are:

- Plantings of additional trees, especially along the western edge as a buffer between the park and the homes on Edgehill drive, as well as near the baseball field.
- A fence to be installed around the basketball court to prevent runaway balls
- Updated bleachers and enclosed dugout fencing (with a roof) at the baseball field



## Set Up in Your Own Yard




